A LUNCH WILL BE PROVIDED FOR ALL PLOUGHMEN COMPETING IN THE MATCH

ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE AGED 13 OR OVER AND UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL ANY PERSON UNDER 13 YEARS OF AGE BE ALLOWED TO DRIVE OR RIDE IN AN AGRICULTURAL VEHICLE ON THE SHOW SITE

THE PLOUGHING MATCH WILL BE CONDUCTED UNDER THE RULES OF THE SOCIETY OF PLOUGHMEN EXCEPT WHERE OTHERWISE STATED IN THE FOLLOWING LOCAL RULES:

- 1. All classes, including all **reversible** classes, will be ploughed in **parallel** plots
- 2. All competitors must be able to provide documentation of appropriate insurance cover for their tractor and plough.
- 3. Competitors must state on their entry forms the make of tractor and plough and number of furrows. Please state if under 30 on the day of the match.
- 4. Competitors must be ready to plough at 9.15 a.m. prompt. **Ploughing must finish by 1:00 p.m.** except for Class 1
- 5a. **CONVENTIONAL PLOUGHS:** After the land has been opened by a double split, the ploughman must stop for judging. No land shall be left unturned. He is then to plough three times round the veering and then proceed to the ridge of the higher number and plough out his plot.
- 5b. **REVERSIBLE PLOUGHS:** After the land has been opened by a single furrow body, (one way only), the ploughman must stop for judging. He is then to plough up and down once towards the **lower number** and then proceed to the ridge of the **higher number** and plough out his plot using left and right hand bodies.
- 6. The depth of the ploughing must be no more than 8 inches in all classes.
- 7. No ploughman may compete in more than one class.
- 8. Rolling of the opening slit is permitted.
- 9. No furrows may be tidied after they have been turned. Ploughs that have adjustable furrow widths must not be altered during the match.
- 10. If there are less than two entries in any one class, the class may be amalgamated with another class at the Ploughing Chairman's discretion.
- 11. At the discretion of the judges, in the event of only three starters in any one class, only two prizes will be awarded. If there are only two starters in any one class, only one prize will be awarded.
- 12. The exhibitor accepts full responsibility for all accidents caused by his machine or employees.
- 13. No purely manufacturers' or implement agents' demonstrators or specialists are allowed to compete as ploughmen at the match. The bona fides of every competitor will be strictly examined.
- 14. Should a competing manufacturer or implement agent be a farmer, or farming contractor, then the competing ploughman must be a full-time employee employed as a regular and in no sense a specialist or demonstrator.
- 15. The judge's decision is accepted as final and binding.
- 16. Any competitor or their machinery deemed to be unsafe by the ploughing stewards will be asked to leave the site.
- 17. No passengers to ride on or in a machine on the show site unless the machine is being demonstrated by a trader.





REBAA - RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 This Association is established for the encouragement of deserving craftsmen and for awarding prizes for skill in Agricultural pursuits generally within that part of Berkshire and neighbouring counties, which lie within a 15-mile radius of Maidenhead Town Hall. The whole of a farm will be eligible for entry if any portion of a holding is within this area. Membership is open to anybody proposed, seconded and approved at the AGM
- 2 The President, President Elect, Chairman and Vice Chairman be appointed at the Annual General Meeting
- 3 General Committee -to consist of: 4 elected officers namely President, President-Elect, Chairman and Vice-Chairman. At the end of each term they would not be eligible for election for 1 year. However the Chairman and Vice Chairman are exempt from this rule. 1 Secretary, 1 Treasurer. 5 or more members, each being chairperson of a respective sub committee or nominated deputy and 1 Sponsorship Secretary. 1 YFC member, to be under 26 years of age. Such nominated members to be elected to serve for 1 year.
- 4 Chairman's Committee to consist of President, Chairman, Vice-Chairman and 2 other nominated members appointed by the Annual General Meeting Functions of the Chairman's Committee to seek the opinions of the members of the Association and make the following recommendations, which are to be brought forward at the October meeting of the General Committee. Recommendations for the posts of President Elect, Chairman, Vice Chairman and Sub committee Chairman. Recommendations for site of next ploughing match. Projections for the next 2-3 years in advance. Consideration and recommendations on any sensitive matters, which arise from time to time. Recommendations for the appointment and honorarium of Hon Treasurer and Secretary.
- 5 There shall be 5 sub committees, or more if required, as at the present time -Ploughing, Entertainments, Domestic, Livestock and Corn & Cultivations Committees
 - The number of members of each sub committee will be left to the discretion of each sub committee and appointments will be by nomination by each committee, subject to confirmation at the first general committee meeting of the year. One third of the membership of each sub committee will retire each year and will not be eligible for re election for 1 year. Sub committee chairmen are exempt from this rule.
 - All sub committees may co opt up to 2 people annually for 1 year for specific needs Each sub committee will each year nominate its own chairman for confirmation at the Annual General Meeting.
 - Each sub committee will be represented on the general committee by its chairman or a nominated person in his or her absence.
- 6 The subscription shall be £20 plus £10 for spouse or partner or as approved by an Annual General Meeting.
- 7 In the case of any member entering an objection he shall deposit the sum of £10, and if such protest be withdrawn, or considered frivolous, the amount deposited shall go to the Association and the decision of the committee on any matter of dispute shall be final. 21 days notice will be given to the members prior to the Annual General

- Meeting, of any proposed alterations to the rules of the Association and that minutes and accounts are circulated at that time.
- 8 The funds of the Association be applied to further the objectives as defined in Rule 1 and that no member shall receive any payment or any benefit in cash or in kind paid from, or chargeable to, the funds of the Association except in one of the following cases:
- In repayment of bona fide disbursements made on behalf of and for the benefit of the Association with the approval of the Committee
- In payment of bona fide supply of goods at or below market rate to the order of the Committee
- In payment of prize money offered in the Association's Schedule of Prizes and due to members in respect of prize winning exhibits
- In payment of honoraria to the Secretary and Treasurer as fixed by the Chairman's committee annually
- 9 If any exhibitor, or his or her representative, should attempt to impose on the Association, or shall willfully violate any of the rules, he shall forfeit the prize or prizes to which he may be entitled and be expelled from the Association and from the show ground.
- 10 Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Association from and against all claims and liability howsoever arising in respect of any accident or injury occasioned by himself or his employee or by any animal, vehicle, equipment or other property of whatsoever kind exhibited by him. Neither the Association nor any of its officers or servants shall be, in any way, responsible or accountable for anything that may happen from any cause whatsoever to any exhibitor or any other person in whatever capacity he may be present or to any animal, vehicle equipment or other property of whatsoever kind brought into or erected on the Show Ground or otherwise in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the holding of the Show.
- 11 Any exhibitor of livestock who shall send for exhibition any animal which to his knowledge is suffering from or has been in contact with any animal suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, shall be removed with due speed by the exhibitor from the Show Ground.
- 12 The Committee reserve the right of rejecting any entry, and also of withholding any prize or prizes awarded.
- 13 No person will be allowed to fix or post any placard on the Show Ground without permission from the Secretary.
- 14 Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at or for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Association's rules and regulations, an it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 15 No competitor can take more than one Association prize in each class.
- 16 All entries must be on the Show Ground by 10 am Judging will begin at 10:30 am except when otherwise stated
- 17 All cups and ploughman's awards will be presented at approximately 3pm.
- 18 Full acknowledgement for all prizes kindly given will be made.
- 19 Use of members' and competitors' personal details shall comply with the General Data Protection Regulations.




